**SUGAR FOR CANNING**

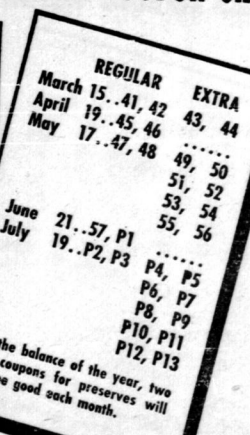
For tasty, nourishing and economical winter desserts, most Canadian housewives will again do some preserving this year... jams, jellies and all kinds of fresh fruits. Sugar is still very scarce. We must continue to conserve our supplies. This year, the allowance for home canning will be the same as in 1944—ten pounds per person. Be sure to use your ration sparingly.

### HOW TO GET SUGAR FOR CANNING

Instead of special home canning sugar coupons, twenty extra preserves coupons in Ration Book No. 5 are being made available for the purchase of sugar for canning. These coupons are good for half a pound of sugar each or the stated value in commercial preserves, for they are the same as any of your preserves coupons. You may use any other valid preserves coupons to

purchase sugar, also at half a pound each. No exchange is necessary. Your grocer will accept any valid preserves coupons when you purchase sugar for canning. There are now only two kinds of coupons for sugar. The regular sugar coupon, good for one pound of sugar, and the preserves coupon, worth half a pound of sugar.

### SUGAR FOR CANNING COUPON CALENDAR



USE ONLY AS REQUIRED  
The twenty extra preserves coupons for sugar for canning will remain valid until declared invalid by the Ration Administration. You do not have to use them immediately. You will be given plenty of notice of their expiry date.

GUARD YOUR RATION BOOK  
If you lose your ration book, the extra preserves coupons which have already been declared valid will not be replaced. It is up to each consumer to look after his or her ration book.

### SO MA ROGERS WENT TO COURT

Everyone loved Mrs. Rogers. For 50 of her 70 years the gentle old lady had lived in the town. She was known far and wide for her generosity and her kind heartedness. Nobody could believe it when she was brought into court for taking rationed foods illegally.

As she ran a boarding house, Ma Rogers was on the quota system. In other words she received coupons every three months to buy a supply of sugar, butter and preserves — enough to cover three meals a day for each of her boarders. Because she was on a quota system, Ma was supposed to collect coupons from the ration books of her boarders every two weeks. These, she was supposed to attach to gunned sheets provided for the purpose. She collected the ration books all right but proceeded to use the coupons to buy rationed foods in addition to those allowed in her quota instead of putting them on the sheets.

When Ma was asked to produce the gunned sheets, she quite freely admitted she had none. "I had to give my boys more pies and cakes," she explained to the Judge. "I didn't think the few extra pounds I bought with those coupons would matter."

Ma Rogers is not alone in underestimating the seriousness of small-time chiselling. Women, ordinarily honest and kind, are frequently found buying with loose coupons, borrowing someone else's ration book or buying without surrendering coupons. If continued, the amount of sugar, butter and preserves acquired in this thoughtless way is enough to disrupt the entire system of rationing.

## Hagersville First District To Go Over

### Heavy Sales Tuesday Give Market Town Lead In Loan

HAGERSVILLE JUMPED INTO LEAD AFTER CALEDONIA LED FIELD IN FIRST EIGHT DAYS OF CAMPAIGN

The Hagersville district loan salesmen put on an extra burst of speed on Tuesday to put their sales total over their objective of \$255,000 and to win for them the honour of being the first canvassing district in Halldamand County to go over the top in the 8th Victory Loan Campaign. Caledonia district under the chairmanship of Alex Arrell led the field by a substantial margin for the first seven days of the loan and looked to be sure to go over the top first. Chairman Bob Laidlaw of Hagersville and his salesmen have again done the unusual and are out on top. On Tuesday night Jarvis was in third position with 58 percent of its quota, Dunnville fourth with 56 percent and Cayuga fifth with 51 percent.

### Fay Head In Liberal Field

Progress in the Jarvis District which led the County in the Seventh Loan is down some this time. On Tuesday night Jarvis district had 58 percent of its quota as against 54 percent at the same time last year. Sales in the Village proper are not keeping pace with the rest of the district or the rest of the County. In order to meet the objective of \$255,000, sales in the Village will have to be stepped up materially from now until the end of the campaign. There is no question that Jarvis will fall down, but it means hard work will have to be done to accomplish the objective.

Pay Head, Reeve of Hagersville for twelve years and Warden of Halldamand County in 1939, was unanimously chosen candidate for the Liberal Party to contest the riding of Halldamand-Norfolk at an enthusiastic convention held in the Court House, Simcoe, last Friday evening. The convention also chose Wilton Honey, a former warden of Norfolk County, to contest that constituency in the Federal campaign.

The Candidate is widely known throughout Halldamand County, having served as a member of the County Council from 1925 to 1938. In December of that year he entered the Service with the 19th Squadron, R.C.A.F., in Hamilton as adjutant of the Squadron. Since that time he has served at various R.C.A.F. Stations across Canada, and retired to the reserve of officers in November of last year with the rank of Flight Lieutenant. He also served in the Royal Flying Corps in the last war. He also has a son in the present conflict, who has completed one tour of operations overseas and is now serving in India.

In accepting his nomination, Mr. Head stated that Ontario needed a leader like Mitchell F. Hepburn and if elected he would support him one hundred per cent. He also promised his support in a move to have Halldamand and Norfolk again become separate ridings.

### New Department For Tourist Plan

W.C. T. C. McALL DOING PRELIMINARY WORK

Announcement of the formation of a new separate division of the Ontario Government to be named the Department of Recreation and Tourist Development was made Thursday by Premier McAll. Mr. McAll is also in charge of his nomination. "I am proud too in having George Drew as my leader. It was a privilege to sit behind him in the Legislature and I predict he will be re-elected in the coming election with a large majority that he had in the past. I have endeavored to serve you faithfully in the past and if elected on June 4th, I promise to give the constituency of Halldamand-Norfolk and the Province of Ontario my very best effort."

Mr. R. P. Vivian, Minister of Health, was the main speaker. He reviewed the progressive legislation enacted by the Government during the past twenty months. "The issues are clear," he said. "We can have a continuance of sound government, or state socialism, or the fork in the road by the Man (Hepburn) who has been all things to all people in the past."

Other speakers included Mark C. Sem, M.P. for Halldamand, T. B. Barrett, Progressive Conservative candidate for Norfolk in the Federal election and B. L. Edgecombe, President of the Halldamand Progressive Conservative Association. Mr. Robert Vance, President of the Norfolk Progressive Conservative Association was the chairman. Mr. Martin's nomination was moved and seconded by Geo. L. Miller of Jarvis and Col. W. J. Townsend of Walsingham.
