On the Farm Front

BRITISH NOTES FOR THE BUSY FARMER

By Haldimand Harry

Call that flock now! At one time it was the practice to cull poultry flocks during the summer. However, ideas and practices change and the time for culling is one of the year and so continual culling is to be recommended.

Furthermore, on July 1st the culling price for fowl will be reduced by one and a half cents per pound. This means that poultry producers will have to take that much less after all the work and expense of raising the birds. The moral then is to cull before the price cut comes to effect. These birds are much more in the market than they are at this time of the year.

Forty bushels of fall wheat to the acre is a big yield and there are very few farmers who ever achieve a record. However, that is exactly what the Haldimand Crop Improvement Association is setting out to do through the formation of a "50 Bushel Wheat Club". Rules and regulations are being set up and very meagre prizes arranged. The Club will also serve as a medium in the production of some good registered seed in the County.

Losses in wheat is probably the most serious disease facing wheat growers in Haldimand. The most reliable method of combating this disease is to use Smut Free Seed.

Loan Sales In Haldimand On Way To All Time Record

Victory Bond sales in Haldimand County, will, from present indications, hit an all time high in the Eighth Victory Loan Campaign which closes on Saturday night. All districts are now over their objectives and Jarvis district is well out in the front with 121 per cent. Hagersville was the first district to go over the top, followed by Caledonia who got away to a flying start at the beginning of the campaign. Dunnville reached their objective in third position, with Jarvis fourth and Cayuga fifth. Jarvis forged ahead the last couple of days however to go out in front and the salesmen are now working to retain that honoured position till the end of the campaign.

Haldimand County also holds the honoured position of being the second County in the Province of Ontario to reach its objective. Being primarily an Agricultural district with no large industrial areas, the achievement of Haldimand County is particularly significant. While the results and the honour that goes with it belongs to the bond buyers, this county has had outstanding leadership in its Victory Loan organization with James N. Allen of Dunnville as County Chairman. In addition each of the district chairmen have given unstintingly of their time and efforts in the interests of the loans and they have been given excellent support through their sales and other committees.

While the war in Europe is over, the need to buy bonds is in no measure lifted and loan headquarters have admonished the salesmen in the daily bulletin as follows: "Let us be sure our Victory Loan organization of salesmen remember they have a job to finish amidst this time of rejoicing. Make certain that, when the loan campaign is finished on Saturday night, every bond that could be sold has been sold."
