### Charges Of Political 'Gestapo' Adds Heat To Election Race

Royal Commission To Investigate Charges

Toronto, May 30 - (CP) - Charges that a secret police has existed in Ontario for the purpose of keeping the Progressive Conservative government in power stirred the Ontario election campaign to new vigor as candidates entered the home stretch to the polls.

C.C.F. leader E. B. Jolliffe said in a broadcast address that a political "gestapo" was maintained by Premier Breview commented on Mr. Jolliffe's, speech that "no man in his right mind would be guilty of such a weird mixture of venom and fiction". He charged that the C.C.F. leader had two purposes in making the charges — to undermine public confidence in the government and to direct attention away from the real issue of the Ontario election campaign.

ier George Drew at public expense to keep the reins of government in the control of the Progressive Conservative party. Denying that any secret police had spied on the government of Mr. Justice A. M. Lebel of the Ontario Supreme Court to act as a royal commissioner in a judicial inquiry into the charges. Mr. Jolliffe maintains that his charges are fully supported by affidavits.

Replying to the C.C.F. leader's charges, the premier said he "had no knowledge of any organization such as he (Jolliffe) describes and had never at any time given any instructions for secret inquiries of any kind"

Mr. Jolliffe named Capt. William J. Osborne-Dempster as being in charge of the secret office on the second floor of an old police garage in down town Toronto and said files at the office contained "half-truths, misin-
