Three Boards — government bodies responsible to Parliament — have had a profound influence on the war effort. Tyo of them — the Wartime Information Board — were created simply to meet the needs of war. The third — the National Film Board — is a permanent government body, like the Canadian National Railways and the Trans-Canada Airlines, the National Gallery and the National Research Council, the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation and the R.C.M.P.
