Ottawa. February 27 - (CP) - Can ada last week bumped squarely into the fact international maturity and responsibility sometimes bring in severe diplomatic headaches.

The full meaning of this newfound international responsibility, an outcome of Canada's large contribution to victory, burst on Canadians in a new and somewhat alarming guise with the violent Moscow reaction to a disclosure in Ottawa that leakages of secret information to a foreign power were being investigated.

It all started with a carefully-worded statement by Prime Minister Mackenzie King, who said a Royal Commission inquiry was being made into disclosures of secret and confidential information to unauthorized persons, including some members of the staff of a foreign mission in Ottawa. Some appeared "far more deeply and consclously involved than others" and a number of arrests had been made. The case, he added, would remain "sub judice" until the investigation was concluded.

Sub judice or not, there was no stemming the tide of rumor, suspicion, report and denial that flooded the capital and other parts of the country after the prime minister's announcement.


