### New British Crown Colony

Union Jacks and Chinese flags flew over Jesselton's bullet-ridden wooden Survey Hall when British North Borneo formally became a part of the British Empire, ending 64 years of administration by the British North Borneo Company. Representatives of the colony's 350,000 population presented Malcolm MacDonald governor-general of the Malayan Union, with an address expressing confidence in progress under British colonial rule. . MacDonald, former British high commissioner to Canada, flew from Singapore for the ceremony

#### \$14,000,000,000 in Reparations

United States Secretary of State James F. Byrnes estimated at the final day's session of the Foreign Minister's conferences in Paris that Russia had already received, directly or indirectly, \$14,000,000, 000 in reparations from Germany Earlier in the week, Soviet Foreign Minister Vyacheslav M. Moloto had demanded \$10,000,000,000.

#### British-U.S. Loan

The United States Congress gave final approval last week to a \$3,750,000,000 loan to Great Britain. The Senate already had authorized the loan, which is intended to rehabilitate Britain's war-disorganized international trade. Washington heard that Britain intended to use the major part of the \$3,750,000,000 loan to buy machinery and raw materials. Anglo-American trade officials believed Great Britain may be drawing upon her loan within a


### Price of Newsprint Up

For the second time in a ten weeks period the price of newsprint has been increased to Canadian publishers, an increase of \$6.80 per ton, effective immediately, following an increase of \$9 per ton that had become effective May 1, 1946. This further increase brings the price to \$69.80, up \$15.80 so far this approximately 30 per cent Since the pre-war price of \$50 a ton the increase is approximately 40 per cent.

#### Fly Imported From B. C. To Battle Budworm

The Agriculture Department announced it is intensifying its annu-al attack on the spruce budworm, which infests an estimated 260,000 square miles of Canadian forest

timber each year. The weapon used against the budworm is a fly known scientifically as phytodietus fumiferance, which destroyed the budworm lar-va, and now is being distributed by the tens of thousands from the

threatening valuable white spruce in an arc running from eastern Manitoba to northwestern New Brunswick and slicing into New York and Vermont, and already has destroyed all the balsam and 50 to 60 per cent of the white spruce in an area of 25,000 square

The budworm defoliates the trees by consuming spruce needles, thus limiting their growth and killing them by successive annual attacks. In whole areas, rich stands of timber have been reduced to bare poles
