WARTIME LESSON

War-time experience was salutary for a certain type of individual—the kind who believed the customer is always right, who was over-bearing and offensive. It must have

been startling to such a person to find himself in the position of a customer. The experience was salutary to the point where the customer is never right. Sometimes the extremes there is a happy medium.

The original intent of the district was largely to the Old Country—England, Scotland—contributing just equal measure the inhabitants of the community. The early days were a sturdy, God-fearing first settled Pastor at a stipend of \$300.00 a year. After Mr. McRobie's death, the congregation was changed from the School House to the Temperance Hall. But in 1881 over a year the congregation erected a frame Church which was dedicated to the memory of Mr. McRobie. Mr. John Horn and Mr. Robert McNeill were ordained as the first elders of the congregation and together with the elders from the Walpole Church, acted as a united Pastorate, which lasted for nearly sixteen years, the membership of the Church was largely increased and the front portion of the present manse was built.
