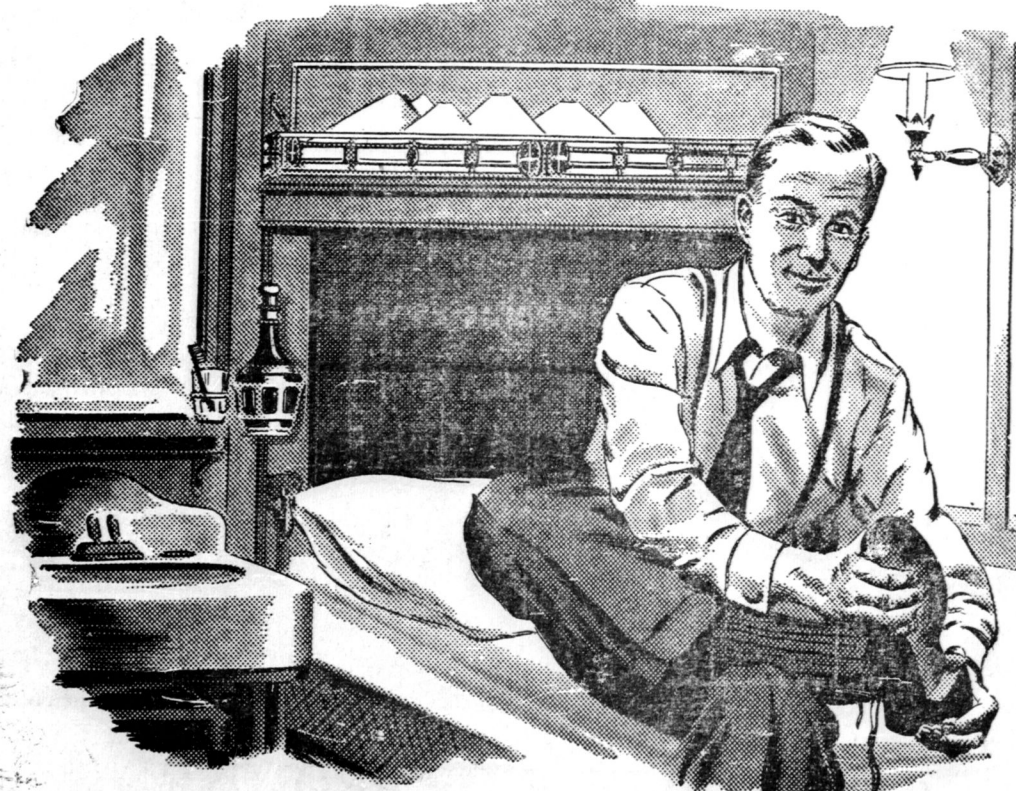

Junior Jottings

(intended for last week)

The Junior Farmers Field Day at the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, on Saturday, June 20th, is the next event on the Junior Calendar for this County. The program includes a football competition for both boys and girls, as well as track and field events. Last year was the first time a meet of this type was held and it was an unqualified success. I feel sure that this year's meet will prove equally successful. We are looking for good support from the Juniors of this area for this Field Day.

This is the time of the year to get after the weeds on your farm. Large weeds in the yards, along fences, and on the roadsides, while perhaps not causing any great financial loss, do make a place very unattractive and give visitors a poor impression. A great many of these plants on fence rows produce enough seed to seed down a good deal of the farm fields and here they do result in a financial loss, partly because of a lower grade of grain and seed, but mainly because they use up the moisture and nutrients so essential to plant growth.

Some weeds may be rogued out of grain fields by hand. This is only practical when the total incidence of the weed is small. Some weeds such as mustard may be killed by spraying or dusting with Sinex or some other Cyanide preparation. The new weed-killing 2-4-D, also a selective type of weed-killer, will kill nearly all broad leaved plants, but has little or no effect on grasses or cereals. This chemical is especially recommended for removing dandelions and plantain from lawns, for getting rid of unsightly patches of burdock, and for killing patches of field bindweed and chocky in cultivated fields. This chemical does not act rapidly, so do not pass judgment on its effectiveness before about a month after its application.

Weeds in pastures are another great problem. They are more often the result of understocking the pasture, than overstocking it. A pasture with a cover of goldenrod is usually a pasture that has not been grazed heavily enough. So the first rule for pastures should be to make sure that they carry enough stock so that they may be adequately grazed for the whole season. If not enough stock is available at all seasons, a pasture should be run over the field, to clip off the long bunches that the cattle have refused, along with the weeds. This must be done early enough in the season to prevent the weeds from maturing seed. If this plan is followed a weedy pasture can be brought back to fairly good production. The presence of hawthorn in a pasture is another good indication while I sat on the ground minus my pants. The hired man called it a "draw".

Too many farmers are still very hesitant when it comes to taking a mower into a pasture. By clipping they not only take care of the weeds, but also remove mature growth, which is neither palatable nor nutritious, and make the way for new growth which is both.
