
PREPPING TO FLASH BIKINI PICTURES



ROCKET 'LABORATORY' TO PROBE IONOSPHERE



To explore a region of the atmosphere never before successfully investigated, the Navy, in collaboration with Army Ordnance engineers, will send a miniature scientific laboratory shooting 100 miles up into the ionosphere at White Sands Proving Ground, near Las Cruces, N. M. Photos and diagrams above show the "lab," which will be contained in the warhead of a V-2 rocket. Scientists at many observation posts will operate a massive array of equipment to track the rocket on its six-minute flight and record the data that it automatically radios back to earth. Diagram at upper left shows recording and radio transmitting devices in the warhead. At left, Dr. E. H.
