Canada's Aid to U.K. Prime nister Mackenzie King announced that Canada will pro-vide a ct dit of \$1,250,000,000 to of a financial agreement between

the two countries.

Mr. King stressed that the immediate purpose of the agreement is to enable the United Kingdom theme of his address to Virginia's to overcome her temporary finan-cial difficulties in purchaling from

Britain in loans and cutright gifts, including the \$1,250,000,000 loan totals about \$4,950,000,000. In 1942 Canada loaned Britain \$700,000,000 of which about \$150,-000,000 has since been repaid. In 1942 there was an outright gift of \$1,000,000,000 and since then mu-tual aid has been given to approximately \$2,000,000,006.

Approximately 1,000 British Indian troops boarded ships last week as the British began to carry out their announced policy of gradually withdrawing their forces from The Netherlands East Indies. The embarkation followed the arrival at Batavia of 2,400 Dutch troops from Malaya. A ommuni-
