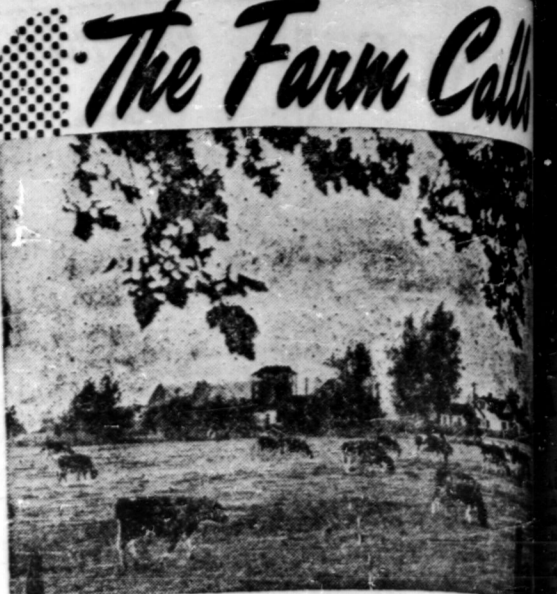

On the Farm Front

BRIEF NOTES FOR THE BUSY FARMER

Frozen foods seem to be the order of the day and ways and means of preparing them for the locker as well as for serving after being frozen are items of importance to the modern farm housewife. These are exactly the matters to be discussed at a special two-day meeting at Selkirk on May 25 and 26.

The first day will be devoted to a discussion of frozen foods in general and the preparation of them with demonstrations being conducted by Miss Evelyn Macdonald, P.A., the demonstrator in charge. There will also be a visit to the local locker plant. The meetings are being sponsored by the Women's Institute and those wishing to attend or desiring further information should apply to Mrs. R. O. Huest, at Selkirk.

Some farmers seem to be of the opinion that to make a good corn silage all one has to have is plenty of stalk and leaf growth and that cobs are not so essential. Such is not the case and in making themselves believe this farmers are only kidding themselves. This is backed up by evidence submitted in most textbooks on feeding. For instance in Morrison's "Feeds and Feeding" it is shown that silage from corn with few ears contains total digestible nutrients amounting to 16.3 per cent whereas corn well eared has 20.6 per cent or an increase of 25 per cent.

It is little wonder then that some farmers claim their stock didn't do well on the silage in some particular year. Usually this occurs when there were few cobs. All of this leads up to the point of selecting a variety for planting that will mature early enough to provide plenty of good silage cobs at time of ensiling. It is feared that many farmers err in this regard.

Making milk now for next fall seems like a paradox and yet that is possible. Next fall's production will be influenced to a very large degree by how production is maintained throughout the summer months. If we allow production to slump during the summer months we will find it doubly difficult and well nigh impossible to regain it by heavier feeding in the fall.

The best insurance any Haldimand farmer can have against such an occurrence is a few acres of temporary pasture. There are many types of annual pastures but one of the best is oats and sudan grass sowed at oats two bushels and sudan grass twenty pounds. Such a mixture

protein hay in the barn. "The proof of the pudding is in the eating." A successful dairy farmer in Oxford County reports that his herd dropped from 12 to 9 cans of milk per day when he changed feeding from a mow of early cut hay to a mow of late cut hay. What happened in Oxford can happen in Haldimand.
