THE LIBERATION OF LIBERTY

FOLLOWING is the text of a speech by St. John Ervine, distinguished dramatist, at a mass meeting of The Society of Individualists, held in Kingsway Hall, London, England.

My Lord, Ladies and Gentlemen: These are times when the Englishman's home, which was once his castle, is in danger of becoming his morning to find in the paper news that some citizen has been arrested because he was found in possession of private property.

Some of us are determined to take care of them that they carry rifles. Those strong, able-bodied men call them in the morning (but not with tea) and put them to bed again at night.

Milk production is a very important item in our agricultural economy and regardless of subsidies or no subsidies we do not want to see a slump in the milk business.

To take full advantage of pasture good grazing methods must be employed. Dairy cows left on pasture will not give as much milk as those on a good pasture.

Others to be considered in good management might be pasture clipping, ample shade during warm summer days, readily available supply of clean cool water, free access to salt and last but by no means the least, control of flies through proper sanitation and effective spray materials.
