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In 1944, of the 472 Canadian factories engaged in the manufacture of wooden fur-niture of all kinds, 208 were located in Ontario. In the same year the gross value of the manufactured products was pproximately \$30,000,000. Nearly 8,000 people were engaged in the industry and more than \$11,000,000 was paid in salaries and wages. Sawn lumber was the princ

pal material used and, while much of the hardwoods used ame from the United States, the soft woods were the product of Canadian sawmills.
