Producers as well as distributors are all for a tight control of the industry, commission evidence revealed. But Mayor J. S. Beck of Bram pton, a voluntary witness, thought lower consumer prices would result if the producer's price remained fixed and the price charged to convaners was open to competition. A former member of the Milk Control Board, he charged that dairies cut prices and gave rebates to big customers anyway so they might just as well compete for all business.

Milk producer W. H. Hallman said farmers cannot make money under \$3.65 a hundredweight. He said American buyers were eager to pay high prices for milch cows, implying that milk farmers may prefer to sell off their herds and go out of business.
