### Table Talks

#### Vegetable Dishes

**Egg Plant Crocks**  
1 medium egg plant  
Boiling salted water  
3 tablespoons mid-flavored fat  
1 small onion, chopped  
1 small green pepper, chopped  
2 tablespoons flour  
½ teaspoon salt  
1 tablespoon brown sugar  
4 large tomatoes (peeled and chopped) OR  
2 cups canned tomatoes  
½ bay leaf, crushed  
½ teaspoon cloves  
¾ cup bread crumbs  
1 tablespoon butter OR  
2 tablespoons grated cheese  
Peel and dice egg plant. Cook for 10 minutes in a little boiling, salted water. Drain. Place in greased baking dish. Melt fat, add green pepper and onion and saute 2 minutes. Add flour, salt and sugar, bay leaf and cloves, and continue cooking 2 minutes. Pour the tomato sauce over egg plant and been combined with the butter or breaded crumbs which have been cooked. Bake in moderate oven, 350 deg. F. for 20 minutes. Six servings.

### Table Talks (Continued)

#### Potatoes in Green Peppers

1 large green pepper  
2 tablespoons fat  
2 tablespoons flour  
1 cup milk  
¼ teaspoon salt  
dash of pepper  
3 cups grated cooked potatoes  
Wash peppers, cut in half lengthwise and remove seeds. Parboil, covered, in salted water until tender but not soft. Drain. Melt fat, add flour and blend well. Add milk, stirring constantly until mixture thickens. Add salt, pepper and cheese. Stir until cheese is melted. Add potatoes and heat over low heat until hot. Serve in green peppers. Six servings.

### Table Talks (Continued) Many people do not like Jerusalem artichokes because they don't know how to cook them. The artichokes (Jerusalem) should be parboiled and dropped in cold acidulated water, that is water (1 quart) to which 1 teaspoon of lemon juice or vinegar has been added. This will prevent the artichokes from discoloring. After being drained they are cooked like other vegetables in a small amount of boiling salted water, until tender, then served with a cream sauce or seasoned with salt, pepper, butter and chopped parsley.




