One thing which has been pointed one by Mr. Bradford is that not only did the demonstration pasture mixture help to increase the yield but he also practised good pasture management. The pasture was top dressed in the winter of 1945 with manure. The plots were clipped in June 1946 time. This kept the weeds down and prevented the pasture from going to seed, at the same time stimulating an even green growth. An application of 200 pounds of 2-12-6 fertilizer per acre was put on a demonstration plot in October, and a half acre of the check plot was also fertilized in the same way to discover whether or not it would help this plot as well.
