**C. A. L. MURCHISON APPOINTED UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE COMMISSIONER**

Hon. Humphrey Mitchell announced recently the appointment of C. A. L. Murchison, K.C. of Ottawa, as a member of the Unemployment Insurance Commission.

The new Commissioner fills the vacancy of the Commissioner left by the resignation of G. W. Ricker.

Mr. Murchison has a distinguished record in the service of the Dominion Government since 1941, when he came to Ottawa from Winnipeg. He accepted a position with the legal division of the War-time Prison and Trade Board, later being appointed a Supervisor of Legal Offices.

He was transferred to the National War Labour Board in April, 1944 as Executive Assistant in Charge of Reviews and in June, 1945, became secretary of the Board. In October, 1946, Mr. Murchison was appointed chairman of the Board and remained in that position until the Board was disbanded early this year.

Previous to 1941, Mr. Murchison practised law in Winnipeg. He was alderman of that city for ten years.

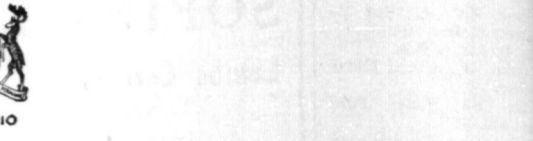

**AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO THE MOTORING PUBLIC**

**Re: 1947 Amendments to the Ontario Highway Traffic Act**

Every motor vehicle owner and driver should become familiar with the new 1947 amendments to the Highway Traffic Act. The purpose of this legislation is to encourage safe driving and to assure the collection of damages awarded by our Courts for personal injuries suffered or property damaged.

**On and After July 1st, 1947**

- On and after July 1st, 1947, your driver's license and all motor vehicle permits registered in your name will be suspended if, following an accident in which any person is injured or any property is damaged, you are convicted of:
- (a) Any violation of a provision of the Highway Traffic Act.
  - (b) If, upon conviction for a violation of the Act even though no accident occurred, the penalty imposed by the Magistrate includes suspension or revocation of your driver's license or motor vehicle permit.
  - (c) If you are convicted of a criminal offence involving the use of a motor vehicle.

**Application of Suspensions**

Where a suspension is applied following the registration of a conviction, same will remain in effect until proof of financial responsibility is filed.

Where a suspension is applied for failure to satisfy a judgment, same will remain in effect until the judgment has been satisfied or arrangements made for its payment by instalments and proof of financial responsibility is also filed.

Proof of financial responsibility may be filed (a) in the form of an insurance policy certificate; (b) the bond of a guarantee company; (c) the depositing of money or securities to the value of \$11,000.00.

**Application of Penalties**

The penalties for a person operating a motor vehicle while his license is under suspension include a fine up to \$500.00 and imprisonment up to six months, also the impounding of the motor vehicle operated. The penalty for the operation of a motor vehicle, the permit for which is under suspension includes a fine up to \$500.00, imprisonment for six months and the forfeiture of the vehicle to the Crown.

**THE WEEK AT OTTAWA**

The Senate's tourist committee heard predictions that 1947 would bring the greatest inflow of visitors in the Dominion's history.

Leo Dolan, chief of the Canadian government travel bureau, told the committee that highways had been the chief target for criticism by visitors of the past.

"There's got to be a tremendous road-building program from Nova Scotia to British Columbia if we want to keep the tourist trade," he added.

The bureau's advertising program had brought thousands of inquiries from Americans planning to come to Canada, and he forecast the inflow this year would surpass the record 21,000,000 who came in 1946.

Hog producers in Ontario, fearing feed shortages as a result of late seeding this year, have taken to liquidating part of their breeding stock and officials of the agriculture departments are worried.

The officials say a heavy crop of feed grains in the Prairie provinces and a steadily brightening picture in Ontario and Quebec does not warrant the panic marketing they add there is every sign that sufficient feed will be available through out the season.

Quantities shipped to Eastern points from the Prairies since the beginning of the crop year (Aug. 1) have reached an all-time record and there is "every indication" the next crop year will surpass even this.
