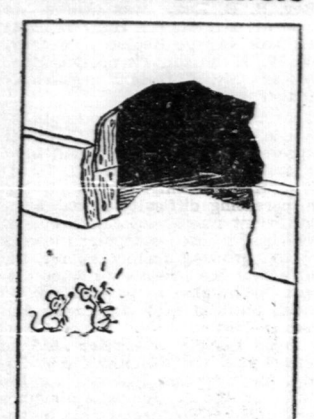

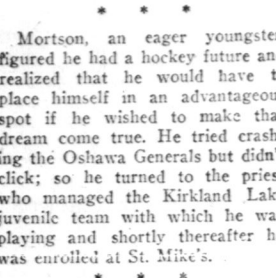

Know Your Star

Rangy James Angus, (Gus) Morton, 185-pound rushing defense rookie of the Toronto Maple Leafs, is not only a self-made hockey star but he certainly didn't let timidly deter him.

Like a great many others in the past few years, Morton did not come under the scrutiny of Toronto's scouts until he reached St. Michael's College. And he arrived at St. Mike's through his own efforts.



Morton, an eager youngster, figured he had a hockey future and realized that he would have to place himself in an advantageous spot if he wished to make that dream come true. He tried crashing the Ontario General's tryouts, but he was turned down by the priest who managed the Kirkland Lake juvenile team which he was playing and about thereafter he was enrolled at St. Mike's.

Aggressive Gus required only 20 minutes or less to convince Maple Leaf scouts that there was a hockey bud beginning to bloom. By the end of the first period of his first game at the Gardens, Morton's name was on file at N.H.L. headquarters as a potential Leaf. It was, as it turned out, a good thing for the Toronto management that such speed was utilized because two other clubs had scouts on hand at that particular game and before the final bell, each club had put in a bid to negotiate with Morton. Toronto's margin, in one case, was two minutes.

This happened in the 1942-43 season. That winter Gus started with St. Mike's throughout the league schedule and then, after the Irish had been eliminated from the O.H.A. Junior "A" playoffs, he was picked up by Oshawa, Ontario, as a military replacement. Gus helped the Generals win the Memorial Cup that year but the next season, back with St. Mike's and improving with age, Morton was a big gun in the Memorial Cup triumph of the Fighting Irish.

Thus, starting with the Kirkland Lake juveniles, who won the N.O.H.A. All-Ontario juvenile in 1942-43, Morton played on three successive championship teams before starting in on his pro career. Signed by the Maple Leafs in 1945, he was optioned to Tulsa Oilers and played a leading role in helping the youthful Oklahomaans fight their way into the United States Pro Hockey League finals. Gus, alternating between defense and left wing, racked up 29 goals and 29 assists for 58 points in league competition and logged one goal and eight assists in the playoffs.

Though born at New Liskeard, Ontario, Jan. 24, 1925, Gus has lived most of his life in Kirkland Lake. Gus is a prospector in the off-season, and spent the past winter working in and around a place called Groundhog, in Northern Ontario.

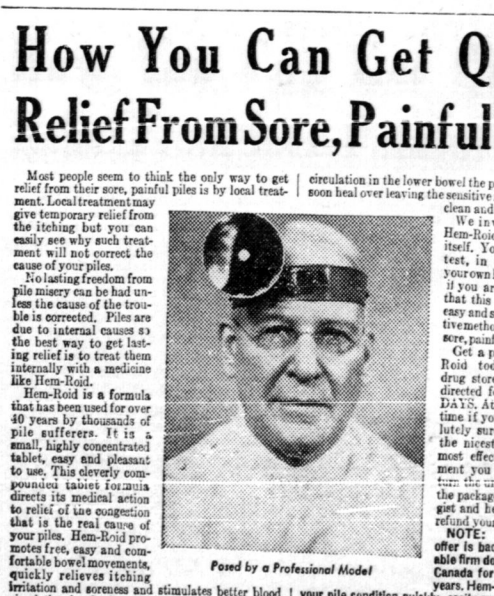

Why Sea Divers Wear Breastplates

The first practical means of exploring the ocean's floor was, curiously enough, devised by an astronomer, writes W. P. Kaskey in the Christian Science Monitor. In 1714 Halley (the man whose name was given to Halley's comet) designed a diving bell.

A little more than a century later, Augustus Siebe invented a diver's suit by means of which solitary divers could descend unattended to the sand or mud of the river or ocean's bottom. One type of diving suit consists essentially of a suit made of rubber matted between two layers of strong canvas. The suit includes a breastplate of metal to guard the diver against the pressure of water. Were it not for this protection, the water pressure would prevent him from expanding his lungs and drawing in air for breathing.

Helmet With Perforations

The diver's head is protected by a metal helmet which has three round windows or portholes. The air hose is attached to the back of the helmet. Through this hose air for the diver to breathe is pumped down from the ship or dock from which he descended. Since the air hose is subjected to very considerable water pressure, it must be reinforced with wire to prevent the pressure from collapsing the hose and cutting off the diver's supply of air. A special valve in the helmet lets out the air that the diver expels in breathing.

16 Pumps Boats

The air pump plays a very important part in underwater operations. For it has been estimated that divers at extreme depths require as much as seven times as much compressed air as they would at the surface.

To make sure that they will be as buoyant as the water he displaces, the diver wears boots with thick lead soles weighing about 16 pounds each and carries perhaps a hundred pounds or more of lead on his back and chest. Otherwise, the air in his suit might make him so buoyant that he would bob up to the surface like a cork.

Potash Found Northwest of Saskatoon

Discovery in Southern Saskatchewan of the first Canadian source of potash is considered the Dominion's most important mineral find in 30 years. Resources Minister J. L. Phipps, said last week. Commercial production of potash found in the Unity oil field about 100 miles northwest of Saskatoon, would "revolutionize" agriculture in Canada which imported about \$1,000,000 worth annually at an average cost of \$40 a ton.

If present indications of the value of the deposits were substantiated \$4,000,000 would have to be spent for a mill and sash before the field could be put into production. The discovery is of national importance since there is no other known source in Canada, Mr. Phipps said.
