Ontario Budget Arouses Public Interest

Ontario, March 12 (CP) — Ontario's budget for 1947-48, announced by the provincial treasurer, has aroused a great deal of public interest. The budget, which is retroactive to the start of the fiscal year beginning April 1, 1947, contains a number of changes. A seven per cent levy on personal income and an increase in the tax on dividends to 15 per cent are the most notable changes. The total revenue of \$50,000,000 is expected to be met by the province.
