Cream 3 tablespoons butter or shortening, add 3 tablespoons sugar ing. add 3 tablespoons sugar gradually, mixing well. Add 1/4 cup sisted flour, 1/2 cup dry, fine cake or bread crumbs, and 1/ teaspoon cinnamon; stir until well mixed and crumbly. Sprinkle on top of cake. Let rise again in warm place about ½ hour. Bake in moderate oven at 400°F. about 20 minutes.
