## Pen, Scissors and Pastepot

The Editor of the Grand River Sentinel pointed out to his readers last week the income taxes were due and payable on April 30th and went on to point out that we all should be grateful of the opportunity of paying taxes in a grand country such as Canada. At the time we were quite impressed with his story but that was before we had set to work to complete our Income Tax form and arrange for the overdrift at the Bank. Some of the pleasure seems to go out of the picture when the final details are attended to.

It is not true that Tommy Snowden's mayoralty duties occupy his full time out at Nanticoke. We saw him driving a tractor on Tuesday afternoon getting the land ready for spring seeding. We thought that when Tommy Snowden retired he would really retire especially after he assumed the office of Chief Magistrate of Nanticoke. If the expression on his face meant anything he was happy of the opportunity of setting aside the cares of his administrative duties to watch the clay clods roll up behind the disc.

An Anglican Clergyman out in B. C. let his hair down last week and bitterly played nickel contributing parishioners who do not provide their ministers with a living wage. He referred to an instance where a collection from some two hundred people showed an average of five cents a person. It is a shameful scandal," he said. Prime Minister King's Labor Minister, Humphrey Mitchell, administrator

ed a verbal spanking to Prime Minister King's white haired boy, David Croft, in the House of Commons last week. David had said that "of all the democratic countries in the world Canada is now the foremost in racial discrimination." He went on to say that the Government's dispersal orders on the Japanese was "harsh", cruel and discriminatory. Listening to a Moscowite born individual speak thusly of Canada was a bit too much for Humphrey. Said he: "Let me say to my friend from Spadina that, like myself, he was born in Canada. The only nations in the history of the world that ever fought for a principle were the nations in the British Commonwealth and when the nation at the head of which this Government stands is accused of persecution, of being cruel, of being foremost in the policy of racial discrimination, may I say the charge is not true and nobody knows that better than the member for Spadina."

Thinking of Parliament our thoughts in the Haldimand Constituency are presently with our member Mark Senn, who has been in the Ottawa Civic Hospital for the past week where he underwent an emergency operation on April 23rd. The latest report is that he is doing as well as can be expected.

There is a huge automobile plant on the outskirts of Moscow, according to a news report, which covers 1200 acres of land and in the twenty-one years the plant has been in operation production has reached the amazing figure of one complete car a day. Down in the small city of Oshawa Canada, there is an automobile plant covering an area of thirty-three acres and they turn out 300 cars a day. Now we know why the lovers of Russia that reside here don't go there to live. They couldn't live long enough to get a new car over there.

Another handsome Warbler is the Chestnut-sided Warbler, which has a clear white breast, a yellow crown to its head a black line through the eye, and a chestnut-brown stripe down its side. It delights in nesting in low thickets, but its nest is a very flimsy affair and loosely constructed. The Blackburnian Warbler is a beautiful combination of orange and black, with a fiery orange throat being a brilliant mark of distinction. These warblers love fitting about tall trees, particularly hemlocks, and they utter a thin shrill song. The Nashville Warbler is one of our first arrivals, and is known by a yellow throat and breast, olive green back, grey head and neck, and a

white eye-ring. The nest of this species is placed on the ground, usually in a small depression concealed by grasses.

A most conspicuous member of this family is the Black-throated Blue Warbler. The solid black throat, grey-blue back, and two white wing patches will serve to identify this bird. In the spring migration these birds are often seen on our lawns as they fit down from the trees. Because so many of these birds will be coming back in the next few weeks the author is attempting to list some of the Warblers that can be seen, if anyone is interested in looking for them.

**BUTTER QUALITY**  
COMPETITIONS ARE ANNOUNCED

The announcements and entry forms for the 1947 Butter Quality Improvement Competitions have just been forwarded to the creameries in Ontario. These competitions are sponsored by the Ontario Creamery Association and are under the supervision of the Dairy Branch, Ontario Department of Agriculture and the Dairy Department, Ontario Agricultural College co-operating.

This is the third consecutive year these competitions have been conducted. The object of the competitions is to improve the quality of Ontario butter and they are open to any licensed creamery in Ontario. The competition period for 1947 covers all butter manufactured between May 1st and October 31st, both dates included.

The following competitions will be conducted this year: Quality, Yeast and Mould, Workmanship, Combined Quality, Yeast and Mould and Workmanship and Keeping Quality. The latter competition is a storage competition in which butter is put into storage during the four high production months of May, June, July and August and graded out of storage in March 1948.

The above competitions have been a big factor in improving the Quality of Ontario butter. In 1946 the quality of butter improved 12 per cent in 1945 and another 8 per cent in 1946 to establish an all time high in Ontario butter quality.

As quality means perfection it becomes more difficult to show improvement. However, the Ontario creamery industry is setting as their objective for 1947 another 5 per cent increase in quality over 1946. It is of interest to note that to date this increase has been attained.
