Britain's political pot seethed and bubbled over an all-party fire after Conservative Leader Winston Churchill got the first "rise" out of Prime Minister Atlee since the Labor party took office in July 1945.

The usually unfringed prime minister, addressing a Scottish trade union meeting at St. Andrews at the week-end, accused Churchill of "nauseous" in criticisms of the government and of supporting "obscene imperialism."

Labour party sources said Atlee was aroused by a steady barrage of criticism in the press and at public meetings, capped by the wartime prime minister's recent speech at a Conservative gathering.

In reply to Churchill's assertion that meeting that the Labor administration was "living upon the American debt," Atlee snapped at the "torrent of abuse" he said had come from the Conservative leader and added:

"If the Labor government is living on the dole, much more so was the coalition government. It is incredible that he should stoop to such meanness."

Churchill did not reply immediately but Sir Maxwell Fyfe, former Conservative Attorney-General told a party rally in Croydon that Atlee has started a new technique - "that of complaining about people complain."

Noting Atlee's contention that the Conservative party had "no drop of policy" to offer, Sir Maxwell said a statement of Conservative party policy would be issued shortly by Richard Butler, one-time minister of education.
