

Lieut. J. E. R. Wood, M.C., of Var ouver, who was captured by the Germans at Dieppe is the editor of Detour", a book of factual stories, anecdotes and verse written by Bri-dish, Canadian and other Allied pris-oners of war in Oflag 1vC, now on oners of war in Oflag IvC, now on sale at bookstores and news stands across Canada. Profits from the sale of the book will go to the Cana-dian Red Cross Society. Lieut. dian Red Cross Society. Lieut. Wood in addition to writing Detour, worked for months producing the book under a multitude of difficulties. The type was set up by the Canadian Army before it withdrew from Holland, and the printing and binding was done by the British Army of the Rhine in Germany. The book's initial sale was in Britain where it received glowing tributes from the press and a gratifying reception from the general public. from the press and a gratifying reception from the general public. Detour is a book of 179 authors, all of whom were inmates of Oflag IVC, at Colditz, Germany, a camp set up for captured Allied officers, considered "bad actors" by the Germans. Lieut. Col. C. Merritt, V.C., is included among the Canadians who con tributed short pieces to the work The book is finely illustrated with pastel portraits and drawings in

tributed short pieces to the work. The book is finely illustrated with pastel portraits and drawings in black and white.

In an interview, Lieut. Wood told something of life in the prison camps and how the monotony was relieved by music made possible by Canadian Red Cross instruments.

Many of the men turned themselves into lawyers, architects, engineers, B.A.'s etc. while in the prison camp. The examination papers were sent out to the University of London and lads were eventually notified if they made the grade, through Red Cross channels. Red Cross, too, had a part in the preparation of Detour, for the Society provided the drawing materials through which the book was illustrated. Says Lieut. Wood, "Every body wanted to do something for Red Cross in gratitude, but didn't know
