BIRD NOTES

Among the Warblers there are groups that have three or four members that are quite similar. One group is that comprising the Connecticut, Mourning, Hooded, Wilson's and Canada Warblers. All of these birds prefer dense low-lying thickets and are most often seen close to the ground, while other warblers are found in the tree-tops.

The Connecticut Warbler has a grey head, neck and upper breast, a yellow belly, and olive green upper parts. It also boasts a conspicuous white eye-ring.

The Mourning Warbler is similar to the above species but lacks the white eye-ring and the grey on its throat blends into a black patch on the chest.

The Hooded Warbler is really a rare visitor to Canada, but one was seen in Toronto this spring. It is olive green above, bright yellow below and from the top of its head a jet black throat. It's face and forehead are therefore a brilliant yellow. Wilson's Warbler is a little smaller than the preceding species, and is all yellow below, olive green

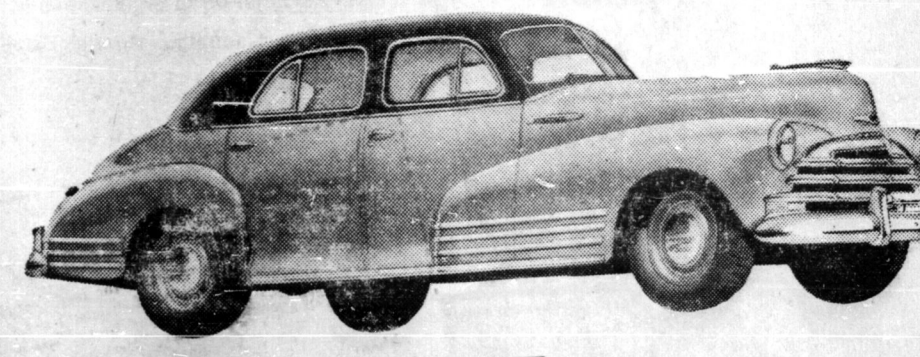
