The Government of Canada will repay the REFUNDABLE SAVINGS PORTION of 1942 Income Tax by March 31st, 1948. If you are one of those who have refundable savings a cheque will be mailed to you BUT—

Your correct present address is essential!

Correct addresses are available for most of those entitled to repayment, but a large number of taxpayers are constantly moving and others marry and their names change.

Cards on which to report changes of address or name are being sent to all householders in Canada. These are being distributed at the present time. Additional cards are available either at your district Income Tax office or your local Post Office. Do nothing if you live at the same address and have the same name as in 1942.

If you are entitled to Refundable Savings on 1942 Income Tax and you have changed your address or name COMPLETE AND MAIL YOUR CARD AT ONCE!

MORE ON MAMMALS

Many mammals are included in the order of Rodentia, or the rodent group, among which are the squirrels, woodchucks, beavers, mice and the porcupine. Squirrels are happy little rodents that have adapted themselves to a life in the trees.

The Red Squirrel is a common mammal all over Ontario, which prefers a habitat of coniferous woods. It does not hibernate but stores up nuts, cones and seeds for the long winter months and it seems to delight in frolicking in the snow.

The Black or Grey Squirrel is found mostly in south-western Ontario and prefers hardwood forests. The black squirrel is a color phase of the grey, that is in a litter of four, two may be grey and two black.

The Eastern Chipmunk is a pretty little rodent that is happy in sunny clearings in forests or along high dry ridges of land. When startled, they instinctively seek the intruder. They also store up food for the winter and it is not definitely known whether they hibernate or just live in their under-ground burrows. There is usually one litter a year with the young numbering four or five.

The Flying Squirrels being tree dwellers are limited to wooded sections and are only found sparsely in Ontario. Because of their nocturnal habits they are rarely seen in the wild. The Flying Squirrels do not actually fly, but by means of a fold of skin joining their front and hind limbs, they are able to glide downward, alighting below as well as ahead of their starting point. Nesting is placed in hollow trees and on the author passed over a dead tree stump which broke in the center disclosing a family of three young Flying Squirrels. Placing the ejected young on my knee and sitting motionless, the adults soon were “flying” all around and it was quite a sight to see them glide forty or fifty feet and then land on my coat and investigate the condition of the young. Eventually the fallen tree was placed upright against another tree, and the young squirrels returned to the nest so that true domestic relations could be resumed.
