WHO GOT THE SUBSIDY ?___

THE RECENT RISE in the price of flour and bread brings to attention the fact that the Government has been paying a very large subsidy to keep the price of these commodities seeming to be low.

This was done by permitting millers to buy wheat to be milled into flour for use in Canada. at 773/8 cents per bushel, compared with \$1.581/2 per bushel, that wheat now costs.

Wheat is being sold to Britain at \$1.55 per bushel, and at much more than that to other This was a clear case of a consumer sub

The millers got nothing out of it, since their prices on flour to bakers had to be fixed with regard to this subsidy. The bakers got nothing out of it since their prices have been

DO YOU REMEMBER those copybook headings in neat, flowing script type which ve labored in vain to imitate in our penmanship lessons at school? 
