Bacon allowance is two ounces per

person per week which is only about

two small slices.

While the above would tend to

show that there is not much to eat

in England today, the fact is that

everybody gets plenty to eat. The En-

glish still eat at least four times a

day, for no one seems to be able to

dispense with afternoon tea about

4.30 p.m.

But the real trouble is there is too

much monotony about the meals,

which are too starchy. There is too

much bread, plain cake and vegeta-

bles, dry goods and clothes. It
