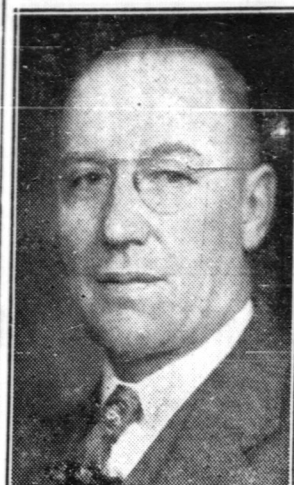

Our Provincial Government has not given us social security. Our Federal Government, by removal of subsidies and price controls, has crippled the cost of living. C.C.F. leaders and members have stood alone in their continual fight for social security by planning our economy to benefit the first and big business last.
