**OBITUARY**

**MR. L. F. BENN**

For the third time since August 1943, the voters of the constituency of Haldimand-Norfolk have registered their confidence in Charles H. Martin, Pro. Con. Candidate for the Ontario Legislature. In the voting on Monday the trend was similar to the three previous elections in nearly all polling sub-divisions with the exception of the town of Simcoe. In the Norfolk County Town Mr. Martin had a majority over his Liberal opponent of 570 votes compared to more than 1000 in the 1945 election and even more in the 1943 by-election. Support for the Liberal party showed a sharp increase in the 1946 election. In 1943 Mr. Martin polled 4492 votes. With Mr. Head as a candidate in 1945 this vote was increased to 6978 and in Monday's balloting, Mr. Martin increased this to 8027.

The C.C.F. ran a poor third in the riding although the voting strength was greater than in the 1945 election. The following is the voting by division in the County of Haldimand-Norfolk with totals for municipalities in the County of Norfolk:
