



FIRST COBOURG HOSPITAL

Cobourg, Sept. 21 — The death occurred here suddenly of Dr. John A Ivey, retired surgeon, in his Eighty-seventh year. He was a graduate of Victoria College when it was located at Cobourg. Born near Jarvis, he came to Cobourg as a youth and received his education at Cobourg Collegiate and Victoria College, going to Toronto for his degree in medicine.

He practiced for two months in Woodstock and then returned to Cobourg. He was responsible for the first hospital acommodation in Cobourg by securing, in the early 1890's. some rooms in the Oid People's Home for use as an emergency hospital. Dr. Ivey retired in 1928, but always retained a keen interest in medical developments.

He is survived by his widow, who was Enid Donly of Simcoe; three daughters, Edith of Cobourg, Helen and Marion, and a son, Jack of Toronto. A sister, Mrs. N. L. Alderson, resides in Toronto.
