GOLF BALLS ON A TENNIS COURT____

A KINDERGARTEN TEACHER friend of mine was giving an object lesson to her class with pictures. And in order to discover how much the children had grasped of her explanations of each picture, she put questions to them. When she came to the picture of "The Gleaners," by Millet, she pointed to the stooping figures and asked, "what are these women do-There was a brief silence. Then a little girl at the rear put up her hand, shaking it excitedly. "Well, what are they doing, Mary? said the teacher. "Looking for golf balls," the child replied.

I was reminded of this incident while reading the poetry of T. S. Eliot, who was recently awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature. In a poem referring to the brevity and vanity of the life of tennis players, "in the land of lobelias," Mr. Eliot reminds them that some day the rabwill burrow and the weeds flourish on their tennis court, and he concludes:

And the wind shall say: 'Here were decent godless people; Their only monument the asphalt road And a thousand lost golf balls.

The answer of the kindergarten child was an innocent one. She was not trying to be funny or facetious. But Mr. Eliot's sudden drop from the sublime to the commonplace was obviously studied for effect, and it was not very clever to introduce golf balls into a deserted tennis court. The only reason for doing so is that they last longer than tennis balls.

Mr. Eliot is fond of dropping suddenly from the sublime; but it is not a new trick even in serious verse. Wilfrid Gibson did it much more cleverly in real poetry before Mr. Eliot left the United States and took up permanent residence

in England. Since Mr. Eliot has received so high a mark of distinction as the Nobel Prize, it may seem a piece of impudence on my part, as a common scribe, to question the decision of literary ex-I have read most of Mr. Eliot's verse, and have discovered poetic feeling in some of his erratic lines. But that can be said of most minor poets. As Doctor Johnson once remarked, if a man writes some hundreds of lines of verse, it would be remarkable if he did not write an odd line of poetry.

So great an authority on poetry as Quiller Couch, when asked what he thought about Mr. Eliot's poetry, said: "Has Mr. Eliot ever written three consecutive lines of poetry in his life?" The "modern" school of poets would, of course, dismiss Quiller Couch as old-fashioned, and point out that Mr. Eliot's work should not be judged by classical standards. In this connection it should be stated that the Nobel Prize was awarded "for his remarkable efforts as a trailblazing pioneer of modern poetry." A trailblazer is one who makes a path through a dense forest along which others may follow, or by which he may return. If "The Waste Land" is an example of Mr. Eliot's trail-blazing, it is the most tortuous and confusing trail I ever ventured into. That poem seemed to have been written by one who was lost in the woods and was

going round in circles. In his later poems Mr. Eliot appears to have got out of the woods, but it was not by blazing a new trail, but rather by following a very old one. From agnosticism he turned to extreme ortho-


