*On the Farm Front*

**BRIEF NOTES FOR THE BUSY FARMER**

Do you know where there is a good field of alfalfa available? It will be recalled that a considerable amount of work has already been done on the question of Alfalfa Seed but unfortunately the problem has become such a serious one that it is difficult to find a field of alfalfa to grow that will give a good crop at all. So much so is the case that those responsible for the research work are finding it difficult to secure enough fields to plant to secure enough fields to grow that will give a good crop at all.

An appeal, therefore, has been issued to all farmers having a field of five or more acres or knowing of such a field to report it at once to the Agricultural Representative at Cayuga. Suitable arrangements can then be made if the field is satisfactory so that the League Research Committee can obtain the use of the field for the current season of 1949.

During the week ending March 30, a total of 92 herds were gone over in the second general B. Test. This included 1162 head of cattle and only eight reactors were found in a total of four herds. The compensation allowed was \$278.00. The area total to date now stands at 633 herds representing 8317 head. A total of 67 head or 8 per cent reactors have been found. This averages out at about two head in each of thirty-three herds where reactors were found. The total compensation now amounts to \$280.00.

There might be the tendency on the part of some poultrymen to sell their layers now. This would be the result of the current high prices for fowl. True, this is a good time to sell but that all the good hens be kept but that all the available eggs be sold to fill contracts and to meet home requirements. For instance, 670,000 cases must be put away before May 31st if our obligation under the 1949 contract is to be filled. Up to March 31st only 290,000 cases had been purchased. This means that there still remains 1,400,000 dozen eggs to be secured, either for storage or for drying in the next eight weeks.

The problem of ridgling in market hogs causes some concern among hog producers. For instance during 1948, 219 ridglings were marketed from Haldimand County. It is true that this is just about one per cent of the total number of hogs marketed but nevertheless it continues to mean a considerable loss to the farmer. This is believed to be largely a breeding problem and should be constantly on the alert to avoid the mating of boars and sows which have a tendency to produce such a large percentage of ridglings. For the Province the figure stands at 5,610 ridglings marketed. This is about one-third of one per cent of the total.

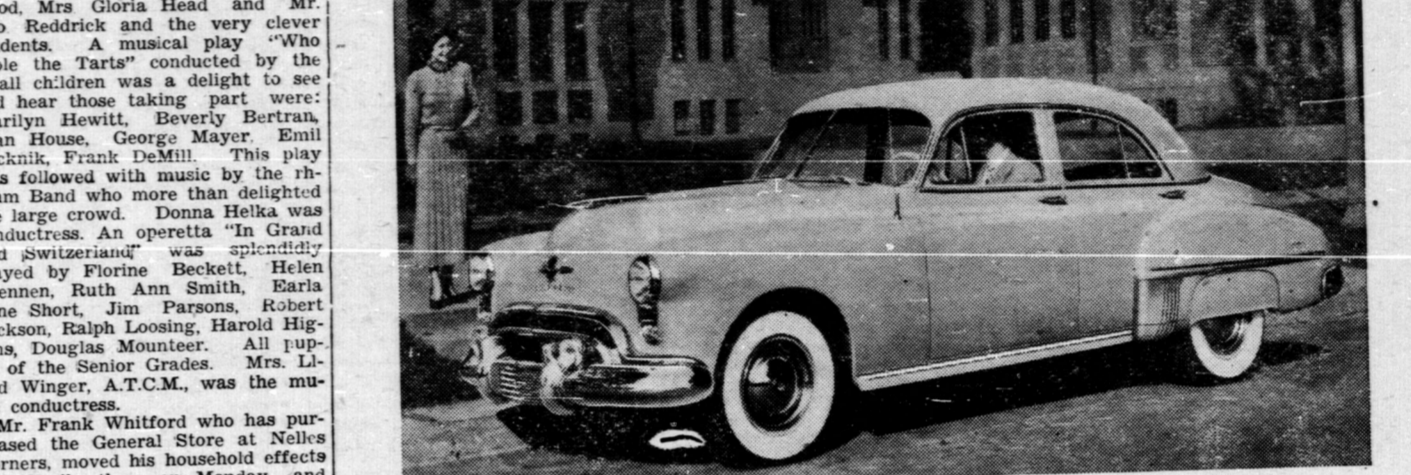
