IS A LITTLE URGING NEEDED?

Speaking at a luncheon-gathering of Agricultural Representatives in Guelph recently, Mr. J. G. Taggart, Deputy Minister of Agriculture, Ottawa, said that there are too many "experts" giving the farmers advice on soil conservation.

He declared that the average farmer knows without being told, that he cannot prosper and be successful on his farm, if he wastes the natural resources from which his produce comes.
That may all be true, but it is not a fact that unless someone does a little urging now and then a problem is generally forgotten?

Another thing. Soil erosion is taking place in many areas in such a slow and almost unnoticeable manner, that the land-owner is not aware of it.
Very small beginnings later develop so quickly that irreparable loss has occurred before it is noticed.

Once before we said that there are crop-improvement associations, livestock improvement associations, livestock improvement groups and a host of other organizations whose chief aim is to make a particular branch of farming more profitable.

Why not then an association which would devote its attention to conservation of the soil and maintenance of its fertility and ability to produce high yields per acre.

We agree with Dr. Taggart that there are perhaps too many high-pressure "experts" preaching to the farmer about things which he already knows more of than do the "experts."

But a little prodding along a certain line has been found good in a great many branches of agriculture.
