DECIDED DROP DURING
PAST YEAR

BOUSTIERIA, Hugh Mitchell, Coyne Leamanufacture was up two per cent;
for evaporated whole milk, fourteen
per cent; for condensed whole milk
about four per cent and powdered
whole milk up five per cent.

Because of the fact that milk production has shown a decided drop and also that, during the past year or more, it has been used to a far greater extent in the manufacture of concentrated milk products, cheddar cheese production in Ontario dropped from 128,348,448 pounds in 1942 to a low of 66,505,199 in 1948. This is indicated in the January monthly report on dairy products from the Ontario Department of Agriculture. Another factor, which may be partially responsible for the decrease is the matter of prices. In 1942 cheese sold wholesale in Toronto, at 20 cents per pound. Butter at that time was selling at 35 cents a pound. In 1948 cheese had climbed to only 34 cents a pound while butter was quoted at 68 cents per pound. Exports of cheese have also dropped considerably. Total amount of Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Newman.


