The Executive and members of the Haldimand C.C.F. Association met in the Court House, Cayuga, on Wednesday evening, February 9th. Five new members were present. The chief speaker was Lorne King of Welland. He spoke extensively from an editorial which appeared recently in the Rural Co-operator to show that the men who were planning and executing Britain's Agricultural Policy were getting very fine results. He said "there is no evidence of regimentation. The planning was democratic and efficient."

When questioned by several vegetable growers who were alarmed over the present surplus of tomatoes, juice and other goods the speaker said "The present surplus is due to the fact that the farmers produce adequate quantities of the products, particularly such health giving products as tomatoes, apples and milk was the penalty we all must pay towards the maintenance of our present standard of living."

PREPARING FOR TOMORROW TODAY

forehanding brighter today, not by stamping out these institutions (that is the slogan of this Boy Scout Week).

An old proverb says: "Never put off until tomorrow what you can do today." This is exactly what Scouting is trying to say to the manhood of not only Canada but of the world as a whole. Unfortunately even today in peacetime, Scouting is being suppressed in many places where it is most unfortunate, in places where it is not suppressed, it is making little headway on account of critical shortages of leaders, that is quite widespread. This is because many adults today fail to understand certain traits in boys and partly because they are pre-occupied with other affairs.

The aim of Scouting is to train boys in "individual efficiency through development of character, health and handicraft in the individual and in citizenship through his employment of this efficiency in Service."

Boys, through natural traits, congregate in gangs and as these gangs develop, leaders appear and as the boys composing these gangs become a gang of younger boys form under the guidance of the older boys. Each gang has its own area and it is these gangs that are the nucleus of the future. This development is becoming very obvious in the hard living conditions of the present recreation, actually practice vandalism. What these boys are learning is the manhood of tomorrow. Some people are afraid of this and are strapping it administered. Perhaps the most serious danger is that it is difficult to see how these methods can make up for deficiencies in a boys upbringing.
