

2 eggs 1 cup sugar 1 cup flour, sifted 1 teaspoon baking powder ¼ teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Scald milk, to which butter been added, and keep hot while mixing other ingredients. Beat eggs until light and foamy. Then ad sugar and beat well with egg bea er or electric mixer. Sift the flour, salt and baking powder and add, beating again 'til well mixed, then add vanilla and hot milk, stirring carefully. Bake in a greased pan, either loaf or oblong flat pan, in a 375° oven. While cake is still warm spread on the following mixture: Two-thirds cup brown sugar, one-third cup melted butter, two tablespoons thick cream and one-half cup cocoanut. Return to oven and leave 'til the frosting caramelizes, but not long enough to dry out.
