



Work in 3 c. more once-sifted bread flour. Knead until smooth and elastic; place in greased bowl and brush top with melted butter or short-ening. Cover and set in warm place, free from draught. Let rise until doubled in bulk. While dough is rising, combine 1½ c. brown sugar (lightly pressed down), 3 tsps. ground cinna-mon, 1 c. washed and dried seedless raisins. Punch down dough and divide into 2 equal portions; form into smooth balls. Roll each piece into an smooth balls. Foil each piece into oblong 4" thick and 16" long; loosen dough. Brush with melted butter or margarine. Sprinkle with raisin mixture. Beginning at a long edge, roll up each piece loosely, like a jelly roll. Cut into 1" slices.
