HELPFUL HINTS FOR BUSY HOUSEWIVES
Stale leaves may be made quite palatable by wrapping in a wet cloth for half a minute. Take the cloth off, then bake in a slow oven for half an hour.
The yolks of eggs, left over when baking require the whites only, if dropped into a pan of boiling and salted water will cook and be ready for your noon salad.
When cooking pancakes dip the spoon in milk or water and the batter will drop off the spoon easily.
When peeling tomatoes scrape the skin gently with the back of the knife, then peel in the usual way. It will be found that the skins will slip off easily.
If an egg has a very thin shell, or is chipped, and likely to crack when being boiled, add a few drops of vinegar to the water.
To bake potatoes quickly, boil them in salted water for ten minutes, then put them into the oven. The boiling water will heat them through more rapidly than if they were placed cold into the oven.

Recipe
Measure into large bowl, ½ c. lukewarm water, 1 tsp. granulated sugar, 1 tsp. yeast, 1 cup lukewarm water. Sprinkle slowly with 1 envelope Fleischmann's Royal Fast Rising Dry Yeast. Let stand 10 min. THEN stir well. Scald 1 c. milk and stir in 6 the granulated sugar, 2 cups milk and lukewarm water. Add yeast mixture and stir in ½ cup lukewarm water. Beat in 3 c. once-sifted bread flour; beat well. Beat in 4 the melted shortening. Work 2 c. most once-sifted bread flour. Knead until smooth and elastic; place in greased bowl and brush top with melted butter or shortening. Cover and set in warm place. Rise from dough, punch down and let rise again until nearly doubled. Punch down dough and roll out, half at a time, into a rectangle's about 14" thick. Lift dough, cover with cloth and let rest 5 min. Brush with melted butter or shortening; cut into strips 1½" wide. BUTTERMILK BISCUITS

¾ cups sifted enriched flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon double action or ½ teaspoon phosphate baking powder
4 tablespoons shortening
¾ cup or slightly more of buttermilk

Method
Have your oven very hot, 500 degrees F. is about right. Sift together the dry ingredients twice. Chop in the shortening with a pastry blender or two knives. Mix the mixture resembles coarse corn meal. Add enough buttermilk to give a soft dough. Stir all the mixture forms a ball.
Now turn out on a slightly floured board and knead for about thirty seconds. Roll to a quarter-inch or thicker and cut with a small biscuit cutter. Put on a greased baking sheet. If a glazed surface is wanted, brush the tops with sweet milk. Bake at 500 degrees F. for about 12 minutes, or until brown. Yield, about two dozen biscuits of an inch and a half in diameter.
And if, after eating this combination I've described today, you should find myself breaking out into "Yoo-hoo's" and "Honey child's" don't blame me. It will be that Southern influence.

CHICKEN GRAVY

For each cup of gravy desired leave two tablespoons of fat in the pan together with any brown crusty portions of chicken that have dropped off. Pour off all the fat in excess of desired amount. Blend in chicken fat in two frying pans for the same amount of fat. Cook, stirring till flour is brown. Slowly add water or milk, one cup for each two tablespoons of fat and one cup. Cook, stirring till thickened. Boil one minute. Season to taste.
