Lee Hanover Writes "30"



'Lee Hanover' Was Pride Of Racing Fans All Over Canada

Forty-six years ago this month, Lee Hanover, the first two-minute trotter in harness, trotted in 1:58 2/5 at Memphis, Tenn. track in 1903, which crowned her queen of the trotting turf. Three days later Major Delmar, over the same oval, stepped off the three-year-old event in preparation for the race record of 1:58 2/5. Since the date particularly the \$30,000 Canadian Star race was started four times as a three-year-old, winning two races, including the rich Canadian Standard and Fred Futurity, and then in the winter quarters that fall with a record of 2:13 1/2. This time was taken in the Futurity and it established a race record for trotters in the class at that time.

Just Shooting Stars??

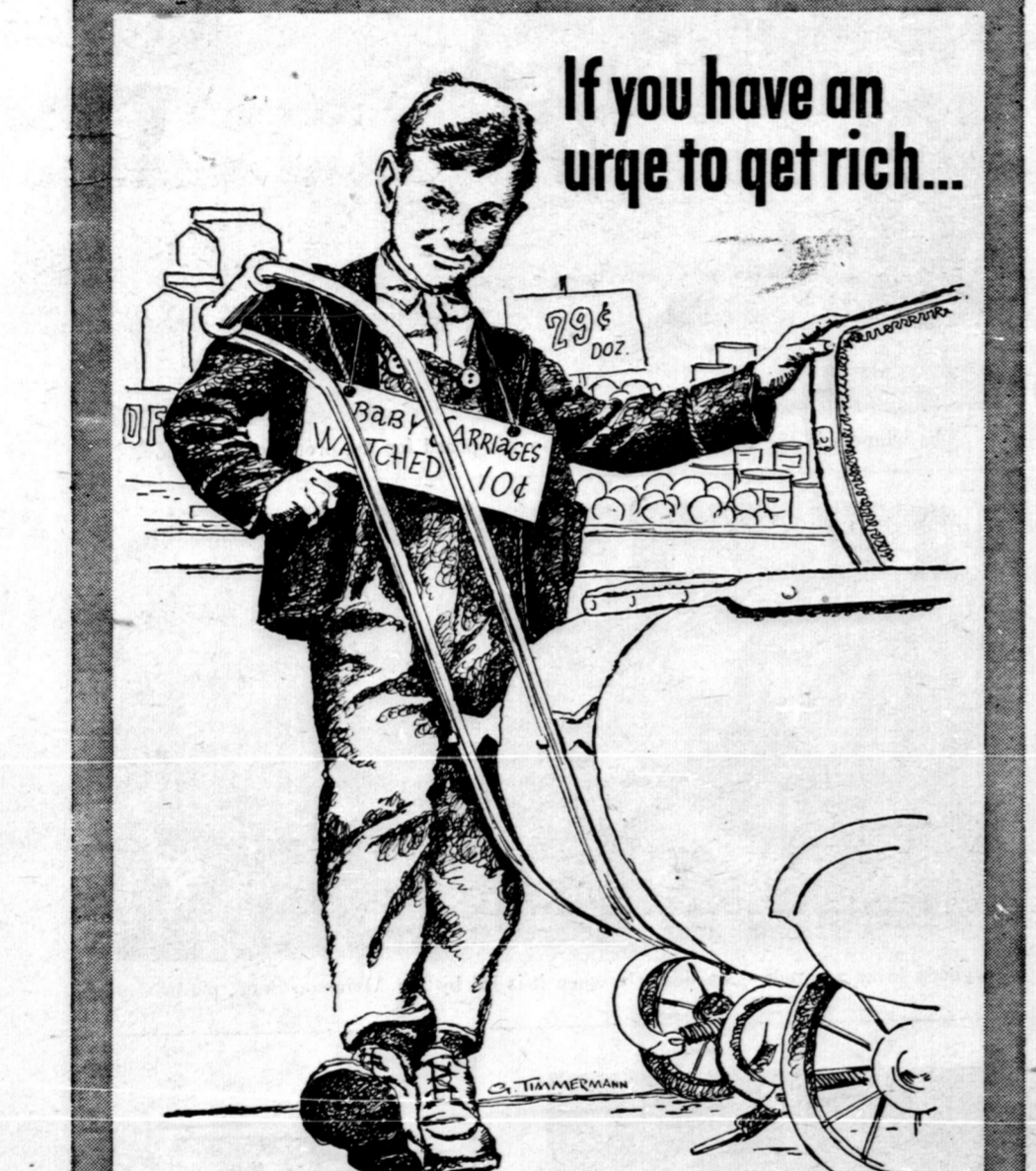
