You can probably make your tractor run on less fuel than that but it doesn't pay to be too stingy either. Too lean a mixture is too hot for your engine to handle properly—it burns and warps the valves. * * *

Perhaps without your even suspecting it, bad valves can let as much as 5 horsepower go out the exhaust instead of to the drawbar. Have your valves ground regularly, keep tappets adjusted, and you won't need to worry about wasting 5 or 6 gallons of gas a day.

Keeping the valves cool calls for a radiator that's clean. Buy some cleaner and flush out the collected scale. Refill, using soft water-such as rain water from a cistern-as the minerals in well water can make your rad look like the inside of a teakettle. Put in a shot of one of those rust-prevention compounds too.

Better take a look at the fau belts, too. If they appear a little frayed, it would be a good idea to pick up some new ones at the earli-
