This column has repeatedly emphasized the importance of organic matter, and one of the more important ways of getting organic matter back into the soil is to return all the straw. Similarly, one of the best ways of getting straw back into the soil is to use it as bedding in the barn where it will serve a two fold purpose. Not only does it add organic matter, but it also contributes to the comfort of the livestock as well as acting as an absorption bed to retain all of the liquid manure which is so high in nitrogen. Following this procedure and then per-mitting the straw to manure to waste
