**Elgin Jaques Dies Suddenly**

The community was shocked to  
learn of the sudden passing of James  
Elgin Jaques, well known Jarvis  
farmer, on Sunday night, December  
17th. Although he had been in poor  
health for the past few years, due to  
heart trouble, his condition was re-  
garded as favorable. He was in his  
Fifty-fourth year.A veteran of the first Great War,  
deceased was a son of John Jaques  
and the late Margaret Miller. Since  
his return from overseas service he  
had farmed in Walpole until three  
years ago when he was forced to  
leave his home due to his health.He was a member of Jarvis Lodge  
No. 191, I.O.O.F. and a member of  
Wesley United Church.Surviving besides his widow, the  
former Flora White, and his father,  
John Jaques, he leaves one son, Carl  
and one daughter, Vera, both of Wal-  
pole, and a sister, Mrs. Lloyd Mil-  
ner, (nee) also of Walpole.The funeral was held yesterday  
morning at 10 o'clock at the late ho-  
me with a family service at 11:30 a.m.  
in Wesley United Church at 2:30 p.m.The pallbearers were: Thos. Rey-  
nolds, Wray Lumsden, Ralph Gowen,  
Earl Sizer, James Brown and Earl

Parkinson, formerly of Jarvis, was

three years of age, had led a very  
active life until advancing years  
compelled him to retire. He was  
born in Walpole Township, July 28,  
1857, he spent the early part of his  
life on a farm and was engaged in  
the cheese-making business, erecting  
and controlling one of the first  
plants in Jarvis, Ontario, in 1904.  
Under his direction it later became  
one of the largest butter factories in  
the county.He was also engaged in the buying  
and selling of Clydesdale horses for  
the county.His retirement took him as far west  
as the Coast. After he moved to  
Jarvis he was always a leading fig-  
ure in any progressive move in the  
community, and was active in con-  
struction work.On his retirement he moved to St.  
Thomas to make his home with his
