planting excessively large acreages. The control of destructive insects can be effected through the use of DDT and two sprays or dust after the first application. These applications, particularly the second one, should be applied early in the morning or late in the evening when bees are not active in the field. If a spray is used, 50% wettable powder at the rate of two pounds to 80 gallons of water per acre should be applied. The pressure required is 125 p.s.i. that at 90 to 85 pounds per acre is recommended. Forage sprayed or dusted with DDT should not be fed to livestock.

Some approval work has been done on the improvement of methods of recovering the alkali seed crop. It is realized that direct combining of forage seed crops is the easiest means of harvesting but at the same time it may be the cause of a low yield because of heavy losses. It is recommended that if possible the alkali might be windrowed at the optimum early stage of seed maturity. After leaving the window to harvest, the seed should be cleaned in a combine with a maximum yields with the least labour demand and will compare favourably with clover mill threshing results.

A good reason for the use of power electrical preferrably, was made at the Annual meeting of the Ontario Research Committee. In the first place it is now known that heavy over-crowding may occur of the seed in the combine and that the seed may be lost. It is suggested that the supply of bees is not sufficient to produce approximately three colonies per acre and that the bees should not be used for anything else.
