

Pictured above is the original Christ Anglican Church at Nanticoke. According to William H. Evans, a lifelong member and former Warden, now in his Eighty-ninth year, this edifice and the present Cheapside Anglican Church were both erected by Edward "Long Ned" Evans, who was a first class carpenter, and a sketch of whose life appeared in this column recently. The striking similarity in the architectural design of both Churches is quite apparent when the above picture is compared with the Cheapside Church which is still being used as a place of worship. Mr. Evans also stated that the present brick Church at Nanticoke replaced the above original Church in the year 1886.
