Robert Evans (1819-1898) married Elizabeth Huffman on December 20th, 1850 and there were eight sons in this marriage, seven of whom grew to manhood. It is this branch of the family which has been continuously connected with Walpole Township since pioneer days.

The eight sons were (a) James who died young; (b) George Evans who was born in Hagersville and also taught at Hagersville; (c) John Evans; (d) Charles R. Evans; (e) William Evans; (f) James Evans; (g) William Evans; (h) James Evans who was named after his older brother who had died.

Elizabeth Evans, born 1814, married Drury John Warren in 1835.
