



Prospects of a phenomenal entry list in this year's International Plowing Match, have made it necessary to restrict competitors. Roy Shaver of Finch, president of the Ontario Plowmen's Association announces.

Only plowmen who have won a prize at a local or county match at some time, will be eligible to compete in the event, Mr. Shaver discloses. It may be necessary in future years, to have been a winner at a county match immediately preceding the International event.

ational event The decision to restrict entries in this way was reached at a meeting of the prize-list committee the other day. It was stipulated that the restrictions apply only to Ontario plowmen, however. The match is open to the world. Any competitor outside of the province is eligible to an

Mr. Shaver explains that the chief aim of the match is to raise standarm of the match is to raise standards of plowing. This along with an unprecedented entry list, has made the change necessary, he explained. County and local plowing matches are planned for all parts of the province and those who have not the province and those who have not the province and who are desir-

yet won a prize and who are desir-ous of competing in the big interna-tional event next October, are urged to enter their local match. Local competitions open in September.

This year's International Plowing Match, which will be staged on the beautiful Nottawasaga Valley Plantations in Simcoe County, has every indication of outclassing any previous event. It opens on October 10 and continues until October 13. Scene of the event is just three miles south of the event is just three miles south of Highway 89 near Alliston. Its location is in Tecumseh Township.
Opening day - Tuesday, October 10 - will be open to the counties of Simcoe, Ontario and York. Total prize money of nearly \$1,800 will be offered and Mr. Shaver says that "as some of Ontario's best plowmen come from these counties, competition should be keen and well up to international standards even on the first

national standards even on the first day."
It has been decided that competitors from Simcoe. York, Ontario, Peel, Halton, Wellington, Dufferin and Grey Counties must provide their own tractors or teams for plow ing. The local committees will provide tractors and teams for those residing outside these counties, at a nominal fee of \$5.00. Application for tractors and teams must be made on or before October 1st for the big
