

Perhaps one should start to think of when to cut hay. True, the crop is later in getting started this year, and there is the possibility of a shortage of hay. At the same time livestock will do better on high quality hay, cut early and with best bulk than when fed on the late cut hay, low in protein and digostibility. To illustrate this it might be stated that grass in the pasture stage is only 52 per cent digestible whereas the same hay left to the hay stage is only 52 per cent digestible.
