### SKETCH OF THE

ERT MECHAN FARM

The farm lately owned by Albert E. Meahan, being the south lot 5, Concession 10, Walpole Township, was patented from the Crown on October 12th, 1841, to the Meahan Company.

June 13th, 1850, the Canada Land Company sold the property to Cavanagh, and he in turn sold it to Stephen Wilcock of the Township of Etobicoke York County on March 30th, 1872.

On November 21st, 1877, Stephen Wilcock sold the farm to James Maud Barnes, who in turn sold it to the Meahan family, farmed the deed being drawn by Charles Backus, a lawyer then practicing in Jarvis.

December 7th, 1881, James Maud Barnes sold the farm to Mathew Wilcock, who in turn sold it to William Irwin, on December 28th, 1881.

October 25th, 1902, John W. Irwin sold the farm to Albert and Andrew Meahan, and on April 2, 1907, Andrew Meahan sold out his interest in the farm to his son, James Maud Barnes, who owned same until Mr. and Mrs. Berenson purchased same on September 28th, 1950.

Primaries are from Aalten, of Gelderland, Holland, and is about thirty miles east of Aalten for eighteen years prior to his coming to Canada. He came in contact with Canadian soldiers when they visited his store, and he was engaged in the World War No. 2. The Canadian soldiers eagerly traded cigars for fresh eggs which Mr. Meahan kept at his store, and on occasion brought the family white goods which had been an unknown territory, had weathered the war with the civilians during the war.

Mr. Meahan was a member of the Aalten where so many men of allied troops were killed when after parachuting into enemy territory, he was killed by the main body of the liberation force from reaching them. He was killed by the enemy while he was fighting without ammunition.

September 8th, 1947, Mr. and Mrs. Meahan and their seven children, John, Harry, William, Albert, Albert, William, and John, were killed in the S.S. Tablita from Rotterdam, Holland, when they were on a tour of the Netherlands.

**J. A. Fleming Retires After Lengthy Service With Bank**

Former Nanticoke Resident Nix on November 7th

On Tuesday night J. A. Fleming, manager of The Canadian Bank of Commerce here for the past eighteen years, said farewell to a lengthy period of banking service extending back for nearly forty-five years. During his career he served in three provinces of Canada and under four banking organizations.

Mr. Fleming, who is a native of Kincardine, on the shores of Lake Huron, started his career with the Bank of Commerce in 1905. Through a series of bank amalgamations he served with the Sterling Bank and The Standard Bank before the latter was taken over by The Canadian Bank of Commerce in 1928.

After leaving Kincardine he served in Manitoba, Alberta and North Battleford, Saskatchewan. Prior to the first world war he served with the Royal Canadian Navy from 1915-18, with the rank of Quartermaster, and was in the general merchant business in North Battleford.

His discharge from the service he returned to the Bank of Commerce in 1918. He was transferred to the Standard Bank at Beaverton. An amalgamation took place between the Standard Bank in 1925 and later to Hensall.

When the Standard was amalgamated with the Bank of Commerce in 1928 he was transferred to Lucan where he served until coming to Jarvis in 1932.

During his residence here both Mr. and Mrs. Fleming have made many friends who are happy in the knowledge that they intend to make their home here in the future. As members of Knox Presbyterian Church, both have given freely of their time in Church endeavours as well as in other activities in the community.

The Record joins with his many friends in wishing for Mr. Fleming many years of happiness and contentment in his well earned retirement.
