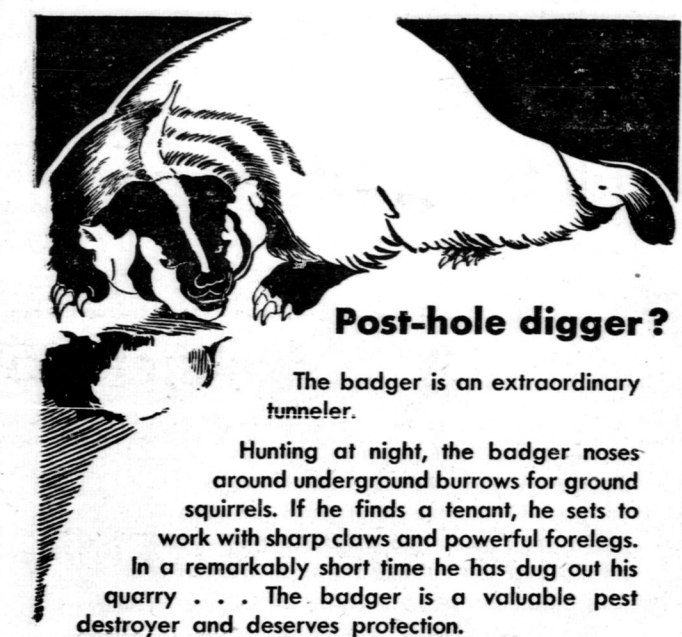

Under such circumstances it is pretty difficult for her to give her accustomed attention to garbage cans but she is doing the best she can. The retailers of Canada are campaigning against Ottawa's proposal to allow the provinces to levy an indirect tax of up to three per cent on retail sales. The retailers are opposed to being forced into the role of tax collectors. Also, since the tax would be charged on their total annual turnover, they point out that if they lost money in any one year they would still have to add the tax to their losses. Again, they state that prices would have to go up to accommodate the tax. The retailers with the lower incomes would have to pay a greater share of such increased prices. Since these retailers have no arguments can be advanced against the proposed tax, consumers will do well to support their retailers in opposition to a hidden turnover tax on retail sales.

We listened to a high ranking government official making replies to a group of newspapermen on a C.B. program the other night. It was obvious the newspapermen wanted real assurance from the government official that the economy could stand the trend toward ever growing security measures from the cradle to the grave. The official answered with the greatest of ease but, it seemed to us, he failed completely to allay the fears held by the newspapermen and, for that matter, the majority of citizens in the country. Much might be said in defence of the present inflationary spiral by way of full employment, lots of money in pockets — until the bills are paid, etc., but what will happen when the dust comes. Someone is definitely going to be hurt then and, it seems to us, it is that semi-conscious fear that is beginning to give everybody the jitters these days. There is bound to be a reckoning and it won't be nice.

By this time next week Finance Minister Abbott will have announced the "bad news." Most Canadians realize he has to find about 3½ billion dollars to meet Government expenses for the coming year and in order to get that kind of money everybody is going to feel it some where.
