Well Known Haldimand Citizen Dies Thomas Marshall, a Liberal Member of the Ontario Legislature from 1911 until 1923, died at his home in Dunnville on Saturday in his eighty-seventh year. The late Mr. Marshall was a son of the late Henry Marshall and Mary Booth Marshall, pioneer residents of Dunn Township who came to Canada in 1829 from Ireland. He first represented Monck riding and later West Lincoln when his name Monck was dropped. He won elections in 1911, 1914, 1917 and 1920 but was defeated in 1923.
